19th Annual Convention Workshop Descriptions

FRIDAY May 29, 2009

3:30-4:30 pm Workshop Session I

Supporting and Encouraging the Homeschool Mom - Phil Downer

This workshop offers encouragement for moms on the challenges of homeschool family life along with tips for how dads can be a vital support to her on issues of sibling conflict, character development, and discipline. Mom needs to take a breather from trying to do everything and find the keys to enjoying deeper relationships with her children. Here she will hear insights on how to see and seize the opportunities in the problems of homeschool family life.

Identifying and Correcting Blocked Learning Gates - Craft

This is for your 'puzzling child'. A child may be a reluctant learner for several reasons. If you have a child who has to work too hard to learn, he is telling you that one or more of his Four Learning Gates is blocked. This workshop will show you what you can do about it at home! It doesn't have to be so hard for your child! You will learn things you never heard of before in a homeschool workshop.

Practical Parenting – What I Know Now That I Wish I Knew Then - Barnier

Why don't kids arrive AFTER we've gained our parenting experience? Why can't we have a rewind button to allow us to *re-do* what we *did do* back when we didn't know what *to do*? Carol shares some of what she's learned through the many ups and downs in her years as a homeschooling mom.

Enjoying Homeschool – An Oxymoron? - Kemmerer

Aaaargh! It's the start of another homeschooling day – and a Monday at that! Do you find yourself hardly able to drag yourself out of bed in the mornings as you face the coming day with dread? This homeschool thing certainly doesn't seem to be working the miracles you were led to expect. If only you could recapture your joy! Rediscover the *contagious* fruit of **JOY**, and watch it grow in your homeschool.

College Rules! - Bruce Eagleson

Success in college can be reduced to strict obedience to some simple rules. Come and listen as Dr. Eagleson shares the tips that took him 30 years to learn. The Eagleson's have 33 years of post high school educational experience from which to draw.

5:00-6:00 pm Workshop Session II

Smart Kids Who Hate To Write - Craft

If you have a child who groans and fusses about writing, or still writes reversals or spells a word orally correctly but leaves out letters when he writes, this workshop is for you! This child's math papers are so hard to read! These children are often thought of as sloppy, lazy, or unmotivated, when they really have a writing glitch. Learn a daily exercise you can do with your child to get the writing into his 'automatic' brain hemisphere. This exercise is used throughout the United States by athletes!

Developing Independent Learners - Hazell

Ideally we desire to give our children a foundation in education that they can use for the rest of their lives. To do this we must establish the foundation for independent learning as soon as possible. It begins when we read aloud to them; teach them to read; and subsequently teach them to learn to love to read. Once they learn the value of good books, we can let them begin to guide their own education.

Teaching Your Child to Read Made Easy - Barnier

Relax. It's easier than you think. This workshop will walk you step-by-step through a simple and easy-to-use method based on phonics and fun combined in a simple game that kids will ask for day after day. The game is learned in one minute but will grow with your child through years of learning. All the materials for this method will cost you less than \$2.00

Winning and Keeping the Heart of Your Young Adult - Farr

As children mature they ask three foundational questions of their fathers. The answers the father *demonstrates* to these questions determines whether he will raise a rebel or a mighty warrior for the cause of Christ. 1. Are you worthy for me to follow? 2. Are you worthy to have my heart? 3. If I give you my heart, will you lead me? This talk will focus on practical steps a father (and a mother) can take to win and keep the heart of their 8-17 year-old sons and daughters. We will also cover valuable leadership lessons for the father to apply in his home. All of the steps suggested have been implemented in the Farr household and have produced lasting positive fruit.

Debate? Who Has the Time? - Au

Are you considering that debate just might be for your family but you are concerned that you don't have the time? This workshop will help families consider the benefits of being involved in competitive debate. We'll discuss typical reactions to the debate calendar and offer suggestions on accommodating both school and debate into the homeschooling calendar and weekly routine. Additionally, we'll explain how to give credit for work completed while preparing for and debating the current year's resolution. In the process, we'll speak of the lessons we've learned and review some of the mistakes we've made. Our entire family will share in the presentation, ensuring a varied perspective on the schedule demands and blessings of debating.

KEYNOTE SESSION

Don't Miss the Gift in This Child - Carol Barnier

Have you ever heard someone say "All children are gifts from God" only to roll your eyes and think... "Ha! They don't know what goes on in my house!" If you don't look for God's gifts, you may be missing some of His best. Come laugh and be encouraged to see just what God had in mind when he designed your child. Learn how to see your child through God's spectacles and how to stay focused on God's vision of your child...not the world's.

11:00am - 12:00 pm Workshop Session I

Teaching the Right Brain Child (Part 1) - Craft

Half of the population is right brain dominant, and half is left brain dominant. You may have a right brain learner in your midst. These wonderful children learn in a different manner than their left brain siblings. In this workshop you will learn how to identify the right brain child, and learn many simple teaching techniques, such as Right Brain Spelling, (making the words to “stick instead of slip”) and Right Brain Reading. Watch your children become good spellers and readers with very little effort!

What Are You Thinking – Learning Styles and Beyond - Barnier

This talk is BIG on the beyond. So often, learning style materials pour all their time and energy into finding the right label for your child’s learning style. (Yes, we now know he’s a right brained, global, sub-dominant, argyle-wearing, rational wombat....but....how do I teach him to spell?) How do you teach history so it sticks? What if she can’t understand fractions? What if he loves language but hates to write? This workshop will be all about "What do we do now?" Come away with lots of ideas you can use Monday morning.

Homeschooling the Strong Willed Child - Phil & Paul Downer

Between the ages of 8 and 13, I (Paul) was a terror! I was a liar, a thief, lazy, self-centered, and had a fiery temper that caused constant problems for my siblings and family. But my parents didn’t give up on me. They applied some very specific biblical principles of discipleship which God used to reach my heart, change my direction, and transform my life. Come hear not only my story, but what they did that made the difference.

Homeschool: “School” at Home or Family Discipleship? - Hazell

As we homeschool we often become overwhelmed by the basics. Textbooks, worksheets and academic performance become the benchmark. We can lose sight of the ultimate reasons we homeschool. If we redefine homeschool as family education perhaps we can transform our expectations. Academics, though important should never overtake character development. Education is learning to be active, intelligent participants in the Kingdom of God.

How to Prepare Your Student for High School and College Level Science - Keller

I will show parent-teachers how to teach students the building blocks for chemistry, biology and physics at the elementary and mid-school grades, boosting students’ confidence as they face progressing to upper level science.

12:15-1:15 pm Workshop Session II

Dad’s Irreplaceable Role - Phil Downer

This is a practical and biblical session on the fathers’ role in training the homeschool family and leading the home. Dad needs to be engaged in instructing, but also in building strong character and strong relationships. He is called to be a strong leader and yet gentle and humble. He is not just a coach, but God’s player-coach. And one of the most powerful secrets of how Dad can be all these things is to start being a three letter word: fun!

Teaching the Right Brain Child (Part 2) - Craft

Once you have identified your right brain learners, become an expert at training those children to use their superior “photographic memory” in many areas of learning. Teach your children the lifelong skill of studying for tests by taking a picture of the contents of a chapter. Works for kids who hate math, too! Math facts and processes finally transfer into their long term memory!

Taking the Pain Out of Research and Report Writing - Goldstein

Do you remember the days of report writing? Mine included hundreds of notecards filled with quotes from numerous sources and hours of trying to assimilate them all together. The end product was a paper filled with someone else's words and loads of frustration! After learning Andrew Pudewa's method of report writing, my daughter and hundreds of homeschoolers I have taught, can read several sources, know how to assimilate information and write a report in their own words, only using quotes for emphasis. This workshop will take you from "quoting" to writing!

The Horror of the Flood - Snavely

Could you explain where the water for a world-wide flood would have come from, and perhaps more important – where did it all go?! Many Christians can't. Understanding the flood (the purpose, the causes, the aftermath and the evidence) is very important to everyone's understanding of a biblically sound creation model. This session covers all the basics about this event, and also includes a video and PowerPoint presentation on the "Hydroplate Theory" of the flood. This theory is a biblically accurate and scientifically feasible portrayal of the flood event.

Surprises at the End of Homeschooling - Mary Ann Eagleson

Are you just beginning the homeschooling journey? This talk is for you, so you can learn in part what is ahead. Are you halfway through the homeschooling journey? This talk is for you, for you may find some help to press on. Are you done or nearly done? This session is for you, because you are on the verge of some surprises and maybe you have some to share as well. Come explore some of the delightful and daunting surprises at the end of homeschooling with Mary Ann as the Eaglesons are soon to graduate their fourth and youngest child.

1:30-2:30 pm Workshop Session III

Media and Entertainment - Monitoring What Influences Your Family - Phil Downer

This session will confront head-on questions like: How can families avoid the opposite extremes of license and legalism? How can children become equipped and committed to standing alone? How can families engage their world without becoming conformed to its values? How can parents remain involved in their children's decisions without becoming controlling or invasive? What is the right approach to making family rules and standards? What is the key to fostering character, virtue, and uncommon leadership in your children?

If I'm Diapering a Watermelon, Then Where'd I Leave the Baby? - Barnier

Why do we start for the kitchen to get a drink for a child, get sidetracked by a paperclip on the floor and end up weeding in the garden with no idea why our child is still thirsty? Why do we have 25 projects started in our day and only 2 or 3 are ever finished? As a self-proclaimed "Gloriously Unregimented Mom", Carol shares stories and strategies from the heart (and from the trenches!) about a home run by a highly distractible mom. She brings to light the many "truths" distractible moms must own if ever they are to develop strategies that work. Best of all, Carol shares her firm conviction that the highly distractible mom has a real and God-given edge over the naturally organized mom. Come and learn and laugh as you find REAL help for the highly distractible mom.

Eight Principles to Shape Your Curriculum - Birkett

Every homeschooler faces many hard curriculum questions. What to cover? When to cover it? Use “Christian” materials exclusively? Am I pushing my child too hard? Not hard enough? And so on. In this workshop, Norman Birkett, will present and apply eight principles to guide you: (1) Think Biblically about your child. (2) Think Biblically about the world. (3) Think Biblically about yourself. (4) Begin at the end. (5) Get there in steps. (6) Buy options. (7) Remember—there is sometimes more than one right answer. (8) Maintain your balance.

Teaching Teen Boys - August

Teaching high school at home can be daunting. You may tell your friends that you are considering sending your son to high school because you don’t think you can teach algebra and biology, but your real reason for these thoughts might be more along the lines of “he doesn’t learn from me anymore” or “I’m exhausted from the battle.” Homeschooling Dad, Mark August will talk about the challenges and rewards of teaching your young men at home as well as provide some parenting and teaching strategies to move you back from the battlefield to the classroom.

Margins for Moms, Limits That Liberate - Barnier
